Use: *The Imperative is for:*

- advice (conselhos)
e.g. *Don't forget to study for the test.*
- instructions (instruções)
e.g. Enter your password.
- orders (ordens)
e.g. Go to your room!
- requests (pedidos)
e.g. Open the window, please.
- invitations (convites)
e.g. Come to my birthday party.
- offers (ofertas)
e.g. Have a biscuit.
- warnings (avisos)
e.g. Look out!
